Invitation to participate in Strategic Discussions

On behalf of the BASI Management Committee, for this month's General Meeting, we extend a warm invitation to each of you to participate in strategic discussions aimed at defining the objectives of the organization so we may customize and ratify our constitution later this year. Your invaluable insights and perspectives will play a pivotal role in guiding our society toward continued growth and success.

The constitution of any organization serves as the cornerstone of that organization, outlining the mission, values, and goals. It is imperative that these foundational elements accurately reflect the aspirations and visions of our diverse membership.

Customising our constitution, rather than just relying on the Model Rules, ensures that it is an accurate reflection of the unique characteristics and goals of our organization, and allows us some flexibility to adapt and evolve over time. The use of clear, concise and easily understood language helps to avoid ambiguity or confusion regarding the interpretation of rules and procedures. promoting transparency accountability within the organization. It is anticipated that involving Members in this process will foster a sense of ownership and engagement, allowing everyone to feel more invested in its success. Customising the constitution also allows us to align our processes and policies with our core values, principles and culture, ensuring that the governance structure and practices reflect the organisation's ethos and contribute to maintaining a cohesive and harmonious community.

While Model Rules provide a useful starting point for an organization, customizing the constitution allows us to ensure compliance with relevant legal requirements and regulations specific to our jurisdiction, and also provides more clarity to ongoing and future Committee Members, other Members and funding authorities when planning necessitates the seeking of grants or sponsorship.

By actively engaging in these discussions, you will have the opportunity to influence the direction of our society and ensure that it remains relevant and responsive to the evolving needs of our community. During these strategic sessions, we will delve into various aspects of our constitution, including:

- 1. Mission and Vision: Clarifying the purpose and longterm goals of our art society to inspire and guide our collective efforts....why are we here?
- 2. Values and Principles: Identifying the core values and principles that underpin our organization's ethos and shape our decision-making processes... what do we believe?
- 3. Membership Guidelines: Defining the criteria for membership and fostering inclusivity to cultivate a vibrant and diverse community of artists and art enthusiasts. ...who should or could be involved?



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4. Organizational Structure and more specifically, succession planning: Evaluating our current structure and exploring potential enhancements to optimize efficiency and effectiveness in achieving our objectives....how do we ensure decision-makers have organizational memory to ensure organizational longevity?

Your participation is essential to ensure that our constitution accurately reflects the collective aspirations of our membership. Whether you are a seasoned veteran or a newcomer to our society, your perspectives are invaluable and will contribute to the rich tapestry of ideas that will shape our future. We invite you to join us in this collaborative endeavor to chart a course that will propel our art society to new heights of excellence. Together, let us reaffirm our commitment to fostering creativity, innovation, and artistic expression within our community. Our next General Meeting is 13 April at 3.30pm and this will be the first of at least two discussions (if not more) leading up to the AGM in October. Your input is vital, and we eagerly anticipate your active involvement in shaping the destiny of our art society.

On behalf of the BASI Management Committee for 2023-2024, we continue to extend an invitation to all members and community stakeholders to be part of the ongoing commitment to establish and sustain a community Arts Centre for local artists and artisans, with spaces to work, teach, socialize and display a permanent exhibition gallery for members.

Bus Trip/Sketching Workshop

Join a group of fellow BASI Members for a tour of an historic home and art collection belonging to Allen Hunter and Carmel Dyer, in West End, Brisbane.

Toonarbin was built in the 1860's. It is a Georgian residence by prolific colonial architect, Benjamin Backhouse. After purchasing the property and a five-year restoration, the property is now a private home and houses a beautiful art collection of Australian paintings spanning the late 1800's to the mid-1900's.

Allen will take great pleasure in leading you on a tour of the house and the art.

Currently, they are promoting their Grow 2022-2026 funding in a variety of ways, some of the most relevant to our community being: Queensland Arts Showcase Program; First Nations Commissioning Fund; Industry placement funding and Queensland music boosts; First Nations Arts Business Grants; and Visual Arts Market Developmet Funds for artists who would like to exhibit or showcase work overseas.
